- During the opening ceremony, the Envoys presented the impacts of water security challenges faced in their communities.
- A dedicated workshop helped to identify solutions and priority actions to tackle global water challenges.

Event impact:

- Envoys are actively involved in IWRA's Early Career and Young Professionals Task Force.
- Envoys will become peer mentors for future World Water Envoys, who will be selected for the upcoming XVIII World Water Congress in September 2023.
- Envoys will contribute to a special issue of IWRA's flagship journal, Water International.
- Envoys applied learnings from the conference to their own communities, contributing to visible and immediate impacts. These include new drinking water pipelines in the Manohara region of Nepal; education for Palestinian farmers that proposes alternatives to pesticides and fertilizers; and laying the foundation for future integrated water resources management in Zimbabwe.
